APRIL 24, 2020 STANDING PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER RELATED TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND NECESSARY RESTRICTIONS ON SHORT-TERM LODGING IN GRAND COUNTY

GRAND COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH DIRECTOR APRIL 24, 2020

PURPOSE

This Public Health Order:

- 1. Is being issued to limit the health impacts of COVID-19.
- 2. Extends to May 21nd, 2020 the Short-Term Lodging Restrictions contained in the Grand County Public Health agency's MARCH 31, 2020 STANDING PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER RELATED TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND NECESSARY RESTRICTIONS ON SHORT-TERM LODGING IN GRAND COUNTY (March 31, 2020 Standing Public Health Order).

EFFECTIVE DATE AND TIME

This Public Health Order will become effective immediately, and will remain in effect until further notice.

EFFECTIVE AREA OF ORDER

This Public Health Order is effective within the entirety of Grand County, including all towns within Grand County.

CONTINUED EFFECTIVENESS OF PRIOR ORDERS

This Order is not intended to limit, rescind, alter, or amend any other applicable public health orders, restrictions, or requirements, other than as specifically stated herein.

MOST RESTRICTIVE STANDARD CONTROLS

To the extent any State and/or Federal orders or laws are more restrictive than what is set forth herein, such State and/or Federal orders control. Individuals should be

aware that new orders are being issued on an almost daily basis from Governor Polis and CDPHE, and all members of the public are responsible for following the Governor's orders, CDPHE orders, and local orders.

ORDER

The prohibitions and restrictions contained Grand County Public Health's MARCH 31, 2020 STANDING PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER RELATED TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND NECESSARY RESTRICTIONS ON SHORT-TERM LODGING IN GRAND COUNTY are hereby extended, and will remain in full force and effect, until May 21, 2020.

FINDINGS

The Findings contained in the March 31, 2020 Standing Public Health Order are incorporated herein by reference.

AUTHORITY AND ENFORCEMENT

This Order is adopted pursuant to the legal authority set forth in sections 25-1-506, 25-1-508, and 25-1-509 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, as well as other applicable laws, rules, regulations, orders, and declarations. Under these laws and regulations, the Grand County Public Health Director: has the duty to investigate and control the causes of epidemic or communicable diseases and conditions affecting public health; to prohibit the gatherings of people to protect the public health, and; to establish, maintain, and enforce isolation and quarantine, and in pursuance thereof, and for this purpose only, to exercise physical control over property and over the persons of the people within Grand County as Grand County Public Health may find necessary for the protection of the public health.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS ORDER IS, IN ADDITION TO THE ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITIES AVAILABLE TO STATE AUTHORITIES, SUBJECT TO LOCAL ENFORCEMENT AND THE PENALTIES CONTAINED IN SECTIONS 25-1-516 AND 18-1.3-501, COLORADO REVISED STATUTES, INCLUDING A FINE OF UP TO FIVE THOUSAND (5,000) DOLLARS AND IMPRISONMENT IN THE COUNTY JAIL FOR UP TO EIGHTEEN MONTHS. FURTHERMORE, PURSUANT TO SECTION 14.8(K) OF THE GRAND COUNTY ZONING REGULATIONS, FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS ORDER MAY LEAD TO SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF THE SUBJECT PROPERTY'S GRAND COUNTY ISSUED SHORT TERM RENTAL PERMIT.

Immediate issuance of this Order is necessary for the preservation of public health, safety, or welfare. Any person aggrieved and affected by this Order has the right to request judicial review by filing an action with the Grand County District Court within 90 days of the date of this Order, pursuant to section 25-1-515, Colorado Revised Statutes. However, you must continue to obey the terms of this Order while your request for review is pending.
